
& Briefing on Pretrial Supervision

A brief summary of the status of PRCS (Post-Release Community Supervision releases, Flash Incarcerations, and 1170 Sentences after 1 year of implementation; and Pretrial Supervision.

### PRCS Updates – After 1 Year October 2011 – September 2012

- Approximately 121 PRCS offenders have been released to Santa Cruz County for Supervision [from Oct. 2011 through Sept. 2012].
- 26 have completed supervision.
- 12 went directly to ICE and remain in ICE custody or have been deported.
- 26 individuals have received flash incarcerations (Approximately 21% of those released).
- ▶ 17 individual have been convicted for new crimes (15% of overall releases) 8 felonies, 11 misdemeanors (primarily for non-violent crimes) and 21 individuals have new pending offenses.


#### PRCS Supervision Risk Levels




#### Flash Incarceration Update after 1 Year October 2011 - September 2012

- 26 total flash incarcerations have been imposed.
- ▶ 17 flashes results in a specific sanction period being imposed (2 revocation filed).
- The average sanction period imposed was 7 days.
- Half the flash incarcerations were for new crimes and half were for warrants/technical violations.

# 1170(h) Sentences after 1 year (October 2011 - September 2012)


- ▶ 84 defendants have been sentenced to 1170(h).
- ▶ 50 straight sentences (60%).
- 34 split or blended sentences (40%).
- Sentences of 24 and 36 months are most common.
- Straight sentences appear to be increasing.
- Over 24 have time served to date.

#### **Pretrial Success Rates**


When examining "appearance " rates, you need to look at defendants that "successfully" completed pretrial supervision by appearing at all their court hearing and those defendants that were held "accountable" for not complying with the term of pretrial release and were returned to custody pending disposition.

- 85% of defendants released on pretrial supervision either successfully completed pretrial supervision <u>or</u> were returned to custody for violating the terms of their pretrial release.
- ▶ 10% failed to appear and a warrant was requested and issued.
- > 5% were arrested for a new offense.
