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NOTICE OF MEETING LOCATION CHANGE

The location of the Little Hoover Commission's hearing on Thursday, August 26, 2010, has changed. The Commission will conduct its third public hearing on the state's long-term care system at 9 a.m. in the Byron Sher Auditorium in the Joe Serna Jr. Cal/EPA Headquarters Building in Sacramento. The building is at 1001 I Street, at the intersection of 10th and I streets.

In this study, the Commission is reviewing California's system of long-term care for seniors and people with disabilities. The August hearing will focus on innovative models for providing long-term care and opportunities for California through health care reform and other initiatives.

The Commission will hear from leaders of successful efforts to improve long-term care programs in Washington state and the city of San Francisco. The policy director from the SCAN Foundation will give an overview of the long-term care provisions of federal health care reform and the opportunities it presents for California and the president and CEO of Partners in Care Foundation will discuss the role of innovative partnerships in long-term care. The director of the Congress of California Seniors, also will comment on how California could improve its long-term care system.

There will be an opportunity for public comment at the end of the hearing. The Commission also encourages written comments. Immediately following the hearing, the Commission will hold a business meeting in the Legislative Counsel Conference Room in the lower level of 925 L Street in Sacramento.

On Wednesday, August 25, 2010, the Long-Term Care Subcommittee of the Little Hoover Commission has scheduled a meeting to learn about state's In-Home Supportive Services program. The meeting will begin at 1 p.m. in the Legislative Counsel Conference Room in the lower level of 925 L Street in Sacramento.
