In its 2012 report, *Rewiring California: Integrating Agendas for Energy Reform*, the Commission found that policies and regulations affecting electricity have been piled upon each other piecemeal with numerous state bodies implementing a long and complicated list of directives through multiple, sometimes overlapping public processes. Despite assembling an ambitious agenda that has gained the world's attention, the state has failed to develop a comprehensive energy strategy with clearly delineated priorities to ensure that policies are not working at cross-purposes and that California achieves its environmental stewardship goals.

The Commission recommended the state develop, through a public process, a comprehensive and cohesive state energy strategy that delineates and prioritizes goals. The Commission suggested that such a plan should sequence implementation of this strategy in a way that maximizes progress toward energy and environmental goals and minimizes avoidable costs. Assembly Bill 1763, as recently amended, implements the Commission's recommendation to develop a strategic energy plan that promotes reliable and affordable energy sources and complements the state's environmental stewardship goals. As a result, the Commission supports this measure.
