Little Hoover Commission Testimony September 22, 2016

Proposition 39 Citizens' Bond Oversight Committees

Suggestions for California Legislature

1 "We will ever strive for the ideals and sacred things of the city, both alone and with many; We  
2 will unceasingly seek to quicken the sense of public duty; We will revere and obey the city's  
3 laws; We will transmit this city not only less, but greater, better and more beautiful than it was  
4 transmitted to us." (Athenian Oath)

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6 Carole D'Elia, Executive Director, Little Hoover Commission, July 29, 2016 in a letter to the  
7 author said, in part, "The Commission also is interested in any suggestions for improving bond  
8 oversight at the state level." Shown below are my suggestions:

9 **Independent Auditors:** Amend Education Code (EC) Section 15278 (b) to provide that the  
10 independent financial auditor and independent performance auditor shall report to the governing  
11 board and the citizens' oversight committee.

12 **Role of Independent Auditors:** Amend EC Section 15278 (b) to provide that the citizens' bond  
13 oversight committee shall have the authority to directed the independent performance auditor to  
14 perform "spot check" audits in real-time without waiting for the annual performance audit report.

15 **Project Lists:** Amend EC Section 15278 (b) to provide that the list of specific school facilities  
16 to be funded as required by the California Constitution (Article XIII, Section 1 (b) (3) (B) be  
17 specific so that it can be determined the amount of bonds monies proposed to be spend on  
18 specific school site(s).

19 **Use of Bond Funds for Technology:** Amend EC Section 15278 (b) to require all school bond  
20 issuance for technology have a weighted average maturity that doesn't exceed 120% of the  
21 average reasonably expected economic life of the financed project.

22 **Bond Issuance:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that the citizens' oversight committee  
23 can review whether an issuance of bonds is fiscally sound.

24 **Temporary Investments:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that the citizens' oversight  
25 committee can review whether temporary investment of bond funds is fiscally sound.

26 **Effective Expenditure of Bond Funds:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that the  
27 citizens' oversight committee can review and determine whether the spending of bond monies is  
28 being done in an efficient, effective and timely manner.

29 Disclaimer: The author of this testimony is speaking in his individual capacity and not as a representative of the California League of Bond  
30 Oversight Committees or the West Contra Costa Unified School District Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee. The recommendations expressed  
31 in this testimony are those of the author Anton Jungherr.

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33 **Financial Reports:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that the citizens' oversight  
34 committee can receive and review financial reports (across all fiscal years) that display for each  
35 project and subproject by cost codes the: original budget, current budget, approved  
36 commitments to date, actual expenditures to date and budget balance.

37 **Change Orders:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that the citizens' oversight committee  
38 can receive and review information on change orders including the reason for the change and  
39 whether the cost of the change will be charged back to a contractor or architect.

40 **Request for Auditor Proposals:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that the citizens'  
41 oversight committee can receive and review the request for proposal(s) for the independent  
42 financial auditor and the independent performance auditor prior to the publication of the  
43 proposal(s).

44 **Selection of Auditors:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that the citizens' oversight  
45 committee can make recommendations to the governing board on the selection of the  
46 independent financial auditor and independent performance auditor.

47 **Evaluation of Auditors:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that the citizens' oversight  
48 committee can conduct an annual evaluation of the independent financial auditor and  
49 independent performance auditor.

50 **Governing Board Response to Recommendations:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide  
51 that the governing board shall publically respond to citizens' oversight committee  
52 recommendations within sixty (60) day of the presentation of the recommendation to the  
53 governing board.

54 **Question:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that any member of the citizens' oversight  
55 committee can question district staff, contractors, consultants, vendors, auditors, architects,  
56 construction managers, financial advisors, bond underwriters, legal counsel and others involved  
57 in the bond school construction program.

58 **Advice on Future Bond Sales:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that the citizens'  
59 oversight committee can provide advice on future bond sales including preliminary designs,  
60 consultant selection, specifications and scope of work.

61 **Ballot Measures:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that the citizens' oversight  
62 committee can review and provide advice on future Proposition 39 ballot measures.

63 **Issuing and Repaying Bonds:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that the citizens'  
64 oversight committee can annually review district arrangement for issuing and repaying bonds.

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65 **Official Bond Statement:** Amend EC Section 15278 (c) to provide that the citizens' oversight  
66 committee can receive and review drafts of Official Bond Statements.

67 **Annual Report:** Amend EC Section 15280 (b) to provide that the citizen's oversight committee  
68 annual report shall include:

- 69 • Whether the district is spending bond monies in an effective and efficient manner.
- 70 • District arrangement for issuing and repaying bonds.
- 71 • Adequacy of district technical and administrative support for the citizen's oversight  
72 committee.
- 73 • District compliance with Education Code Sections 15278, 15280, 15,282, 15284, 15286  
74 and 15288.

75 **Legal Counsel:** Amend EC Section 15280 (a) (1) (c) to include independent legal counsel  
76 where the citizens' oversight committee is the client with attorney/client privileges.

77 **Membership:** Amend EC Section 15282 (a) to provide that one member appointed to the  
78 citizens' oversight committee shall have construction expertise and that one member shall have  
79 financial expertise. This recommendation is in lieu of the current two (2) at large members now  
80 required. The total minimum number of members would remain as seven (7) the same as current  
81 law.

82 **Length of Term:** Amend EC Section 15282 (a) to delete "minimum" so that it is clear that each  
83 term is for two years. Some districts have interpreted the current language to permit terms of  
84 more than two years as the current language reads, "... shall serve a minimum term of two years  
85 ...."

86 **Nominations:** Amend EC Section 15282 (a) to provide that the four legally required positions  
87 be appointed from nominations made by each of the respective organizations specified (business  
88 organization, senior citizens' organization, taxpayers' organization, and parent-teacher  
89 organization).

90 **Performance Audit Objectives Compliance and Program Effectiveness and Results:**  
91 Amend EC Section 15286 to provide that bond measures in excess of \$100,000,000 shall be  
92 required to have annual performance audits prepared in accordance with Government Auditing  
93 Standards objectives for compliance and program effectiveness and results.

94 **Restraining Order:** Amend EC Section 15284 (a) to delete language requiring that a citizen has  
95 to be an ad valorem taxpayer on real property to bring an action to obtain restraining order. This  
96 proposed amendment would permit any citizen to bring such an action.

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97 **Conflict of Interest/Unqualified Member:** Amend EC Section 15284 (a) to add governing  
98 board appointment of a member with a possible conflict of interest or appears unqualified to  
99 serve as a member of a citizens' oversight committee.

100 **Sanctions:** Impose sanctions for school and community college districts that fail to adhere to  
101 constitutional and statutory requirements of Proposition 39, such as preventing the district from  
102 adopting future bond measures under the reduced voter threshold (Little Hoover Commission  
103 2009 recommendation) and preventing the sale of unissued bonds

## Anton Jungherr

#### CHAPTER 1.5.

#### Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000 [15264 - 15288] ( Chapter 1.5 added by Stats. 2000, Ch. 44, Sec. 3. )

#### ARTICLE 2. Citizens' Oversight Committee [15278 - 15282] ( Article 2 added by Stats. 2000, Ch. 44, Sec. 3. )

15278. (a) If a bond measure authorized pursuant to paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution and subdivision (b) of Section 18 of Article XVI of the California Constitution is approved, the governing board of the school district or community college shall establish and appoint members to an independent citizens' oversight committee, pursuant to Section 15282, within 60 days of the date that the governing board enters the election results on its minutes pursuant to Section 15274.

(b) The purpose of the citizens' oversight committee shall be to inform the public concerning the expenditure of bond revenues. The citizens' oversight committee shall actively review and report on the proper expenditure of taxpayers' money for school construction. The citizens' oversight committee shall advise the public as to whether a school district or community college district is in compliance with the requirements of paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution. The citizens' oversight committee shall convene to provide oversight for, but not be limited to, both of the following:

- (1) Ensuring that bond revenues are expended only for the purposes described in paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution.
  - (2) Ensuring that, as prohibited by subparagraph (A) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution, no funds are used for any teacher or administrative salaries or other school operating expenses.
- (c) In furtherance of its purpose, the citizens' oversight committee may engage in any of the following activities:
- (1) Receiving and reviewing copies of the annual, independent performance audit required by subparagraph (C) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution.
  - (2) Receiving and reviewing copies of the annual, independent financial audit required by subparagraph (C) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution.

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(3) Inspecting school facilities and grounds to ensure that bond revenues are expended in compliance with the requirements of paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution.

(4) Receiving and reviewing copies of any deferred maintenance proposals or plans developed by a school district or community college district, including any reports required by Section 17584.1.

(5) Reviewing efforts by the school district or community college district to maximize bond revenues by implementing cost-saving measures, including, but not limited to, all of the following:

(A) Mechanisms designed to reduce the costs of professional fees.

(B) Mechanisms designed to reduce the costs of site preparation.

(C) Recommendations regarding the joint use of core facilities.

(D) Mechanisms designed to reduce costs by incorporating efficiencies in schoolsite design.

(E) Recommendations regarding the use of cost-effective and efficient reusable facility plans.

**15280.** (a) (1) The governing board of the district shall, without expending bond funds, provide the citizens' oversight committee with any necessary technical assistance and shall provide administrative assistance in furtherance of its purpose and sufficient resources to publicize the conclusions of the citizens' oversight committee.

(2) The governing board of the district shall provide the citizens' oversight committee with responses to any and all findings, recommendations, and concerns addressed in the annual, independent financial and performance audits required by subparagraphs (C) and (D) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution within three months of receiving the audits.

(b) All citizens' oversight committee proceedings shall be open to the public and notice to the public shall be provided in the same manner as the proceedings of the governing board of the district. The citizens' oversight committee shall issue regular reports on the results of its activities. A report shall be issued at least once a year. Minutes of the proceedings of the citizens' oversight committee and all documents received and reports issued shall be a matter of public record and be made available on an Internet Web site maintained by the governing board of the district.

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#### CHAPTER 1.5.

#### Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000 [15264 - 15288] ( Chapter 1.5 added by Stats. 2000, Ch. 44, Sec. 3. )

#### ARTICLE 2. Citizens' Oversight Committee [15278 - 15282] ( Article 2 added by Stats. 2000, Ch. 44, Sec. 3. )

(a) The citizens' oversight committee shall consist of at least seven members who shall serve for a minimum term of two years without compensation and for no more than three consecutive terms. While consisting of a minimum of at least seven members, the citizens' oversight committee shall be comprised, as follows:

- (1) One member shall be active in a business organization representing the business community located within the school district or community college district.
  - (2) One member shall be active in a senior citizens' organization.
  - (3) One member shall be active in a bona fide taxpayers' organization.
  - (4) For a school district, one member shall be the parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the school district. For a community college district, one member shall be a student who is both currently enrolled in the community college district and active in a community college group, such as student government. The community college student member may, at the discretion of the governing board of the community college district, serve up to six months after his or her graduation.
  - (5) For a school district, one member shall be both a parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the school district and active in a parent-teacher organization, such as the Parent Teacher Association or schoolsite council. For a community college district, one member shall be active in the support and organization of a community college or the community colleges of the district, such as a member of an advisory council or foundation.
- (b) An employee or official of the school district or community college district shall not be appointed to the citizens' oversight committee. A vendor, contractor, or consultant of the school district or community college district shall not be appointed to the citizens' oversight committee. Members of the citizens' oversight committee shall, pursuant to Sections 35233 and 72533, abide by the prohibitions contained in Article 4 (commencing with Section 1090) and Article 4.7 (commencing with Section 1125) of Chapter 1 of Division 4 of Title 1 of the Government Code.

#### ARTICLE 3. Bond Accountability [15284 - 15288] ( Article 3 added by Stats. 2000, Ch. 44, Sec. 3. )

15284. (a) An action to obtain an order restraining and preventing any expenditure of funds received by a school district or community college district through the sale of bonds authorized by this chapter pursuant to paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution and subdivision (b) of Section 18 of Article XVI of the California Constitution may be maintained against any officer, agent, or other person acting on behalf of, that school district or community college district, by a citizen residing in the school or community college district who is assessed and is liable to pay an ad valorem tax on real property within the school or community college district, or who has paid an ad valorem tax on real property within the school or community college district within one year before the commencement of the action if it appears by the complaint or affidavits that any of the following conditions are present:

- (1) An expenditure of funds received by a school district or community college district through the sale of bonds authorized by this chapter is for purposes other than those specified in paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution.
  - (2) The expenditure is not in compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution.
  - (3) That an expenditure in violation of paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution will be made or will continue to be made during the litigation that would produce waste or great or irreparable injury.
  - (4) The governing board of a school district or community college has willfully failed to appoint the citizens' oversight committee in violation of the requirements of Section 15278.
- (b) An action brought pursuant to this section shall take special precedence over all civil matters on the calendar of the court except those matters granted equal precedence by law.

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**ARTICLE 3. Bond Accountability [15284 - 15288]** (*Article 3 added by Stats. 2000, Ch. 44, Sec. 3. )*

15286. Consistent with the provisions contained in subparagraphs (C) and (D) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution, the required annual, independent financial and performance audits for the preceding fiscal year shall be submitted to the citizens' oversight committee established pursuant to Section 15278 at the same time they are submitted to the school district or community college district, no later than March 31 of each year. These audits shall be conducted in accordance with the Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States for financial and performance audits.

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**ARTICLE 3. Bond Accountability [15284 - 15288]** (*Article 3 added by Stats. 2000, Ch. 44, Sec. 3. )*

**15288.** It is the intent of the Legislature that upon receipt of allegations of waste or misuse of bond funds authorized in this chapter, appropriate law enforcement officials shall expeditiously pursue the investigation and prosecution of any violation of law associated with the expenditure of those funds.
