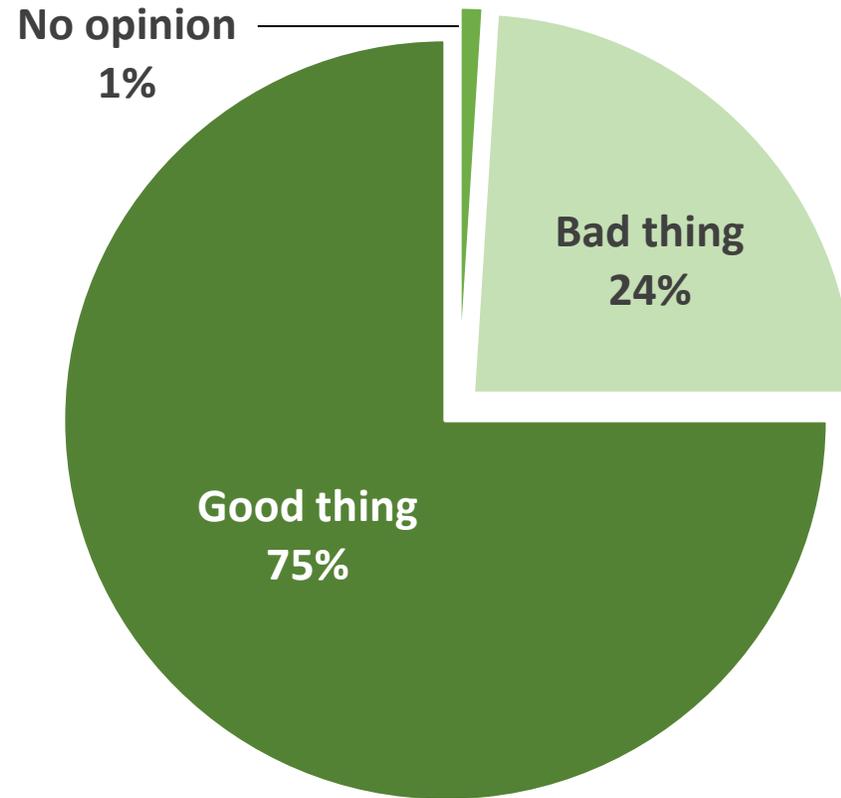

## About the Early September 2021 *Berkeley IGS Poll*

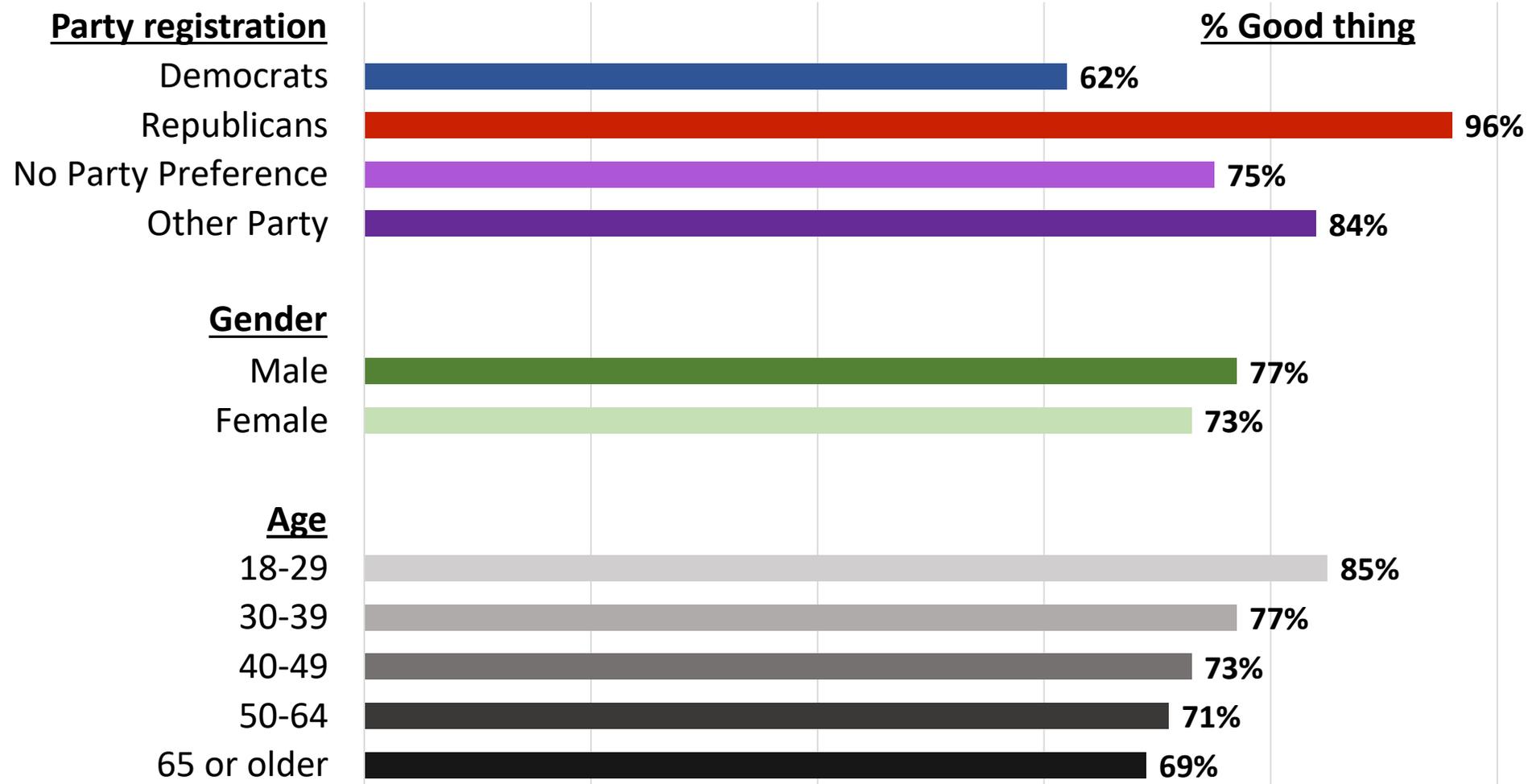
- **Auspices:** The poll was conducted by the non-partisan Institute of Governmental Studies (IGS) at the University of California, Berkeley, which conducts periodic surveys of public opinion in California on political and public policy issues facing the state. Funding for the poll was provided to IGS in part by the *Los Angeles Times*.
- **Data collection period:** August 30 – September 6, 2021
- **Methodology:** Online by distributing email invitations in English and Spanish to a stratified random sample of registered voters drawn from the state's voter rolls.
- **Weighting:** The overall sample was weighted to align it to demographic, political and regional characteristics of the California registered voter population.
- **Sample size:** 9,809 California registered voters.
- **Sampling error:** +/- 1.8 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.

# Three in four voters say it is a good thing that the California constitution provides a way to recall state elected officials



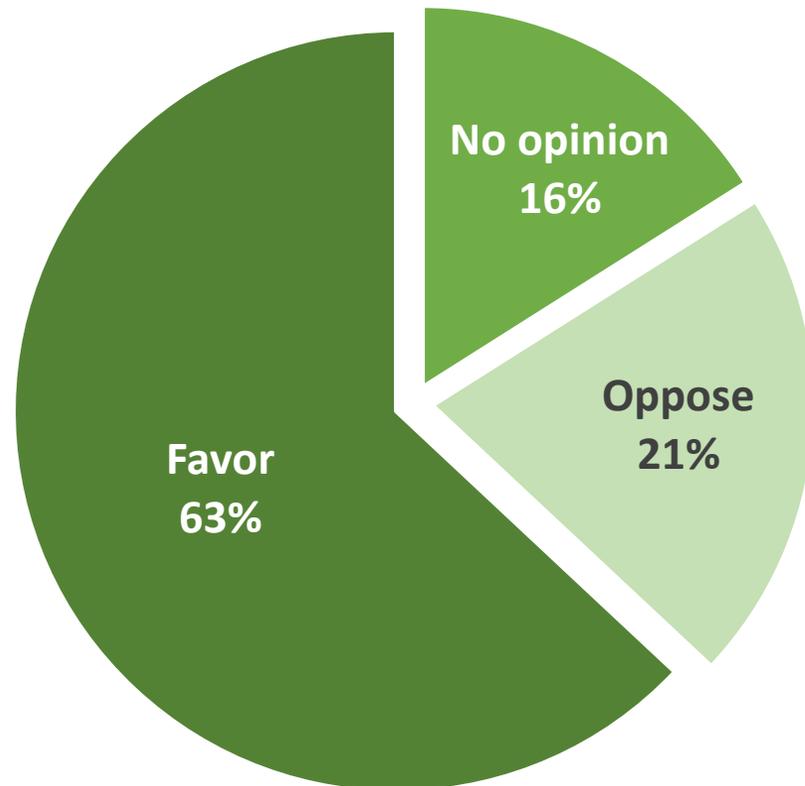

# Voters support making a number of changes to the recall election process, but opinions about proposals vary by party

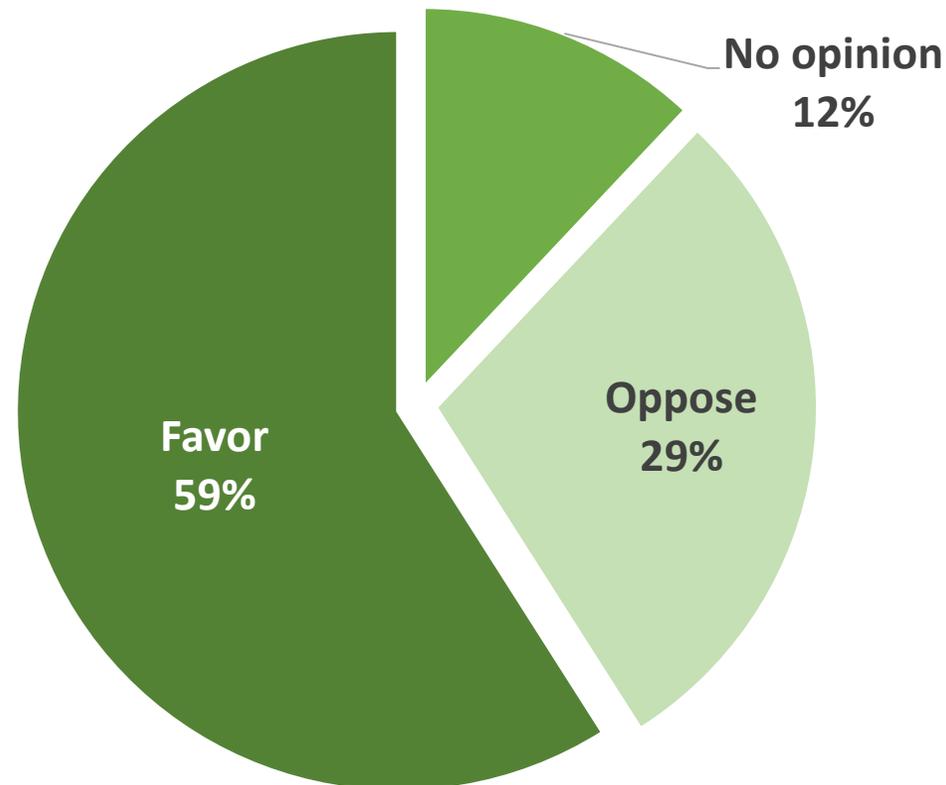
**Proposal #1:** *Change the rules in replacement elections so that if no one receives a majority of the vote, a runoff election is held between the top two vote getters.*

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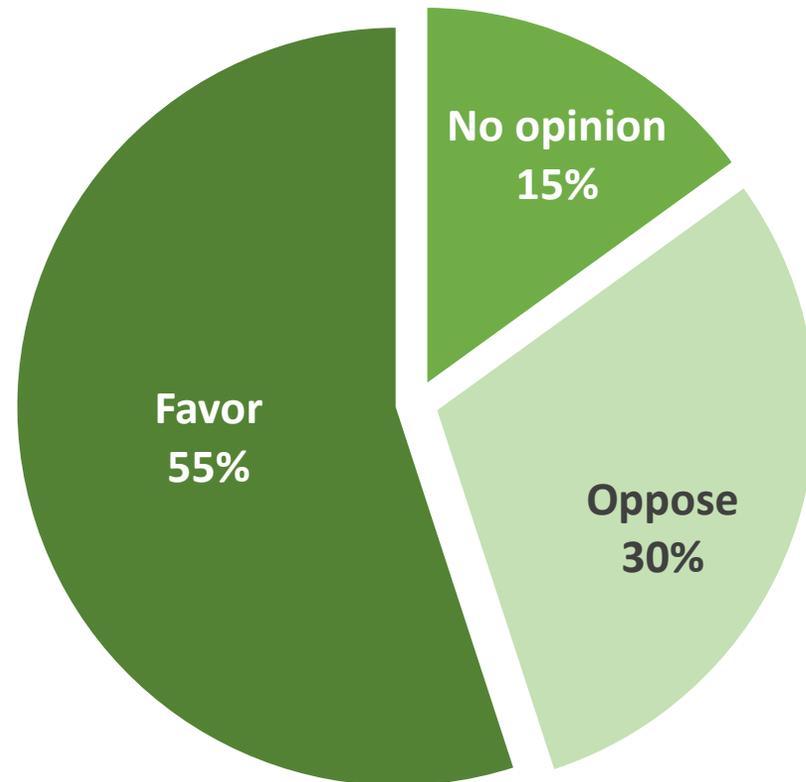
**Proposal #2:** *Toughen the rules for recalling state elected officials so they can only be recalled for cause, such as when an officeholder commits illegal or unethical conduct.*

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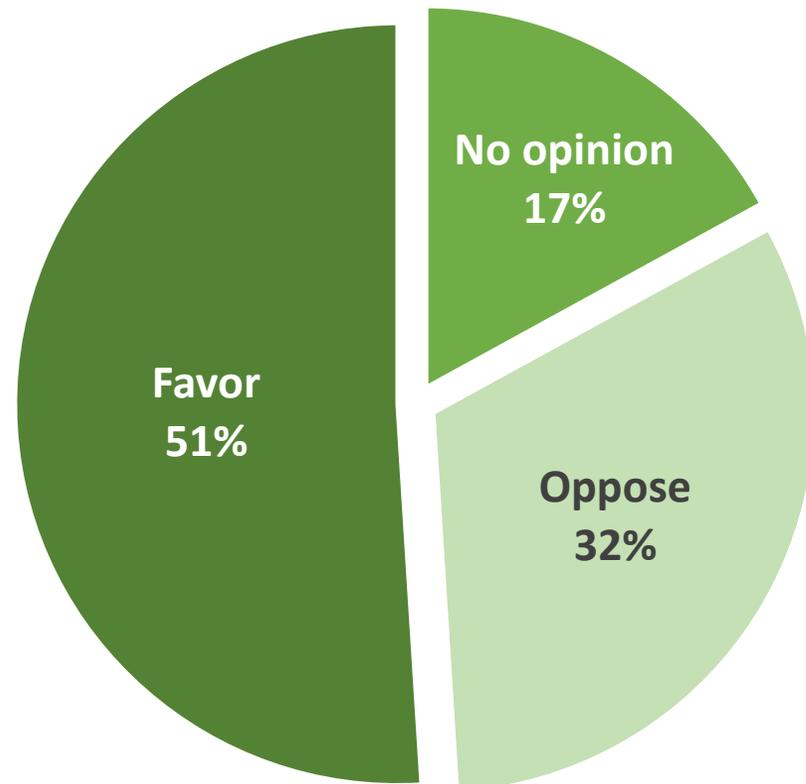
**Proposal #3:** *Increase the number of signatures required to qualify a recall election for the ballot from 12% of the total votes cast in the last statewide election to 25%.*

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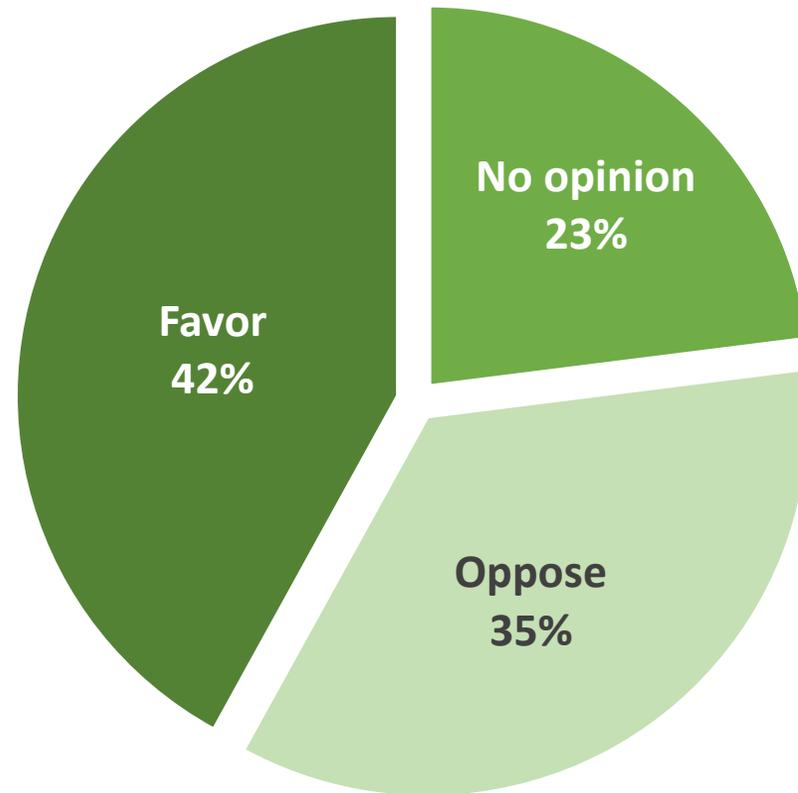
**Proposal #4:** *Make it more difficult to run as a candidate in a gubernatorial recall by instituting a higher threshold than the current \$4,000 filing fee and 7,000 voter signature requirements.*

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**Proposal #5:** *Allow officeholders facing a recall election to be listed among the candidates in the replacement election.*
